Frederick, a military veteran who spent his early years traveling the world as the son of a diplomat, had also decided to take a chance at online dating. Ethel and Frederick matched, sharing a love of dancing, music, and creating memories. “He always has a way to make me laugh,” says Ethel. Their bond grew stronger, leading to a heartfelt proposal and an amazing wedding.

Ethel, who is now 87, cares for Frederick who is 88. While their love continues to nourish their souls, they found they also needed nourishing food. Meals on Wheels Diablo Region was the match for their needs and their family who cares for them. They began receiving meals from the organization’s new Cultural Cuisine Program, which offers Latin-American inspired meals. It was a choice that satisfied their palates, while ensuring that they were well-fed. “Some nights, my mom would be so tired at the end of the day that she would sleep instead of having dinner,” explains her daughter, Shiela. “MOW Diablo Region’s home-delivered meals means that she does not have to skip meals, and the wellness checks also give me peace of mind.”

Ethel and Frederick are grateful for the Cultural Cuisine meals from Meals on Wheels Diablo Region and their compassionate volunteers. “It’s part of the love that always surrounded us,” concludes Ethel.

THE POWER OF partnerships

Meals on Wheels Diablo Region recognizes the power that comes from partnerships. We witness how working together with other organizations allows us to have a profound and lasting impact on the lives of seniors.

During the pandemic, we partnered with the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano to create the Grocery Bag Program. This program delivers healthy groceries to homebound elders who need additional food but can't get to the Food Bank distribution sites. The Grocery Bag Program has been a game-changer for food-insecure seniors and we continue to expand to more communities.

Two years ago, MOW Diablo Region partnered with Choice in Aging, Contra Costa Senior Legal Services, and Empowered Aging to create the East Contra Costa Senior Resource Initiative, supported by the John Muir Community Health Fund. The goal was to help seniors who face barriers in accessing services. Because of its success, the program is expanding Countywide.

Our Fall Prevention Program also benefits from its partnership with the Fall Prevention Coalition of Contra Costa County. Service providers and individuals meet quarterly for both learning and information-sharing ideas that help build a stronger network to help frail elders.

We are also a part of the Countywide Elder Abuse Prevention Program. Together with the Family Justice Center, the District Attorney's office, Contra Costa Senior Legal Services, Empowered Aging, Adult Protective Services and others, we work to protect seniors who are experiencing abuse.

Last year, MOW Diablo Region had a fire in its office. Through our membership at East Bay Leadership Council, we were connected to fellow members BPM who offered us temporary office space. This support is helping us during our displacement and has allowed us to continue to deliver meals and services uninterrupted to our clients.

"Our partnerships demonstrate how we are stronger together," says Caitlin Sly, Executive Director. "When we come together with the goal of improving the lives of seniors, it not only benefits our older neighbors, but the entire community."
