### WEARING TWO hats

There are many reasons why people volunteer. For Shadi Agoughi, a member of Meals on Wheels Diablo Region's Finance team, that reason was deeply personal.

Shadi had previous nonprofit experience when she joined MOW Diablo Region in 2023 and quickly felt at home. Once she learned about the organization's Friendly Visitor Program and the need to find a Farsi-speaking volunteer, she signed on for double-duty. "I lost my mother two years ago, and I have regretted not spending more time with her," explains Shadi. "Volunteering allows me to honor her memory."

The Friendly Visitor Program matches volunteers and clients who have similar interests. Language can be a barrier to finding a match, but Shadi has formed special bonds with her clients, Soheila and Haideh.

Soheila, who lives alone, has become like family to Shadi, earning the affectionate nickname "mom." Even Shadi's dog, Pumbaa, showers Soheila with affection whenever she comes along on a visit!

Haideh is new to Friendly Visitors, and since she is coping with the recent loss of her son, she finds great comfort in Shadi's visits. "It helps to be able to talk to someone in your own language," says Shadi.

Shadi's immigration journey helps her empathize with older people from other countries who may have a difficult time communicating with others and feel isolated and depressed. "I remember when I immigrated from Iran, and how it felt to start anew. It was exciting, but it could be lonely, too."

The Friendly Visitor connections that Shadi has made have brought mutual happiness and healing, bridging cultural gaps and alleviating loneliness. Her story highlights that volunteerism is for everyone, offering unexpected joys that enrich both volunteers and seniors.


# on our plate
